## May Stimulus Shoot – Tournament Chairman's Report

Well, everyone, we had one good shoot. Most notable was the fact that our own President, Mr. Jim Walker, was actually a signed in participant. He's only done that one other time in the last 9 years because of Cook Shack duties. So, to you folks stepping up and helping out I'm sure he thanks you, I certainly do.

Saturday morning things started out pretty slow. A couple of us thought this may have been a mistake; but, we were wrong. By closing time we had about 79 shooters signed up. Sunday began really slow also; however, we managed to attract enough interest to finish the shoot with a total of 95 registered shooters, 46 of whom were there for both days. That, by the way, is 4 more shooters than we had for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Leg of the IBO.

Another notable item; B – course was setup backwards and was the brainchild of Edo Gebinini. There were many great comments made about that course's arrangement. And believe me, by doing that it gave a whole new perspective to shooting at CRB!

We set the range up with only using the first nine targets on A-course and 10 targets on C-course (which was setup backwards like we'd done for the IBO shoot). On Saturday D-course had 11 targets for a total of 30. On Sunday we closed D-course and had B-course open with 11 targets. Two 'special' shots were setup for bonus 20 bonus points. Total available points on Saturday were 338 (an elk on D-course had no 11 ring and the floating gator was worth 20 pts). Total available points on Sunday were 348 (we still had the gator for 20 and added the steel deer for 20 points).

Top Shooter for the event with a 560 was Matt Martin, Male Bowhunter Release (MBR). Ed Ely (Male Open), with 539 and 13 elevens came in 2<sup>nd</sup> overall with Mike Mounts (also Male Open) being third (although he tied Ed for total points, he had two less elevens than Ed).

Another thing I saw at this shoot that I've never seen before was a lady shooting a compound with fingers. We have no Female Bowhunter Fingers class, so she placed first in the "I – have – no – idea – category." Congratulations, Tami.

In the CUB class, Owen Martin placed first with a 491. His closest competitor, Aaron Thompson, was a hundred points behind.

We had a couple who show up to most of our shoots place 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Master Seniors category. Diana was happy she'd beat out her husband Jim. Maybe next time, Jim.

In the MBR, first place was, of course, Matt; second went to James Lewis, and third to Tony Lewis (the kid whipped his dad by 19 points). Male Senior Release category had Dana Thompson in first with 481 points, Dave Garrison in second, and James Goldbaum in third.

Male Bowhunter Fingers class found Dan Clinage Sr. in first with 520 points, Mike Garrett in 2<sup>nd</sup> and Brian Nelson at third.

Male Open class first place was Ed (mentioned above), Mike Mounts in second, and Shaun Thorson in third place.

Since it was such a short notice shoot we didn't expect much; BUT, we did have a GREAT time (FANTASTIC Weather!) and made some money (just about the same as we made at the IBO).

Hope to see you all at the Warmup and Bownanza! And you Hunters – DO NOT FORGET THE BROADHEAD shoot in August. It's the perfect opportunity to tune up for hunting.

## **NO BROADHEADS ALLOWED on COURSES or FLAT RANGE!**

As we start a new season at the Range; all members please be advised, that broadheads are NOT ALLOWED anywhere on the range except at the broadhead pits. There are now signs at the beginning of each course and at the Flat Range stating "No Broadheads Allowed". If anyone is caught with broadheads other than in the respective area, they will be disciplined accordingly. This could be suspension or being expelled from the Club and/or invoiced for any damaged carpet bales (\$400 each). The following are the Standing Rules that will be strictly enforced.

Standing Rules:

Sec 4: Use of Practice Butts (Flat Range)

c. No broad heads or blunts are allowed on the practice butts (Flat Range).

Sec 6: Use of Animal Target Range

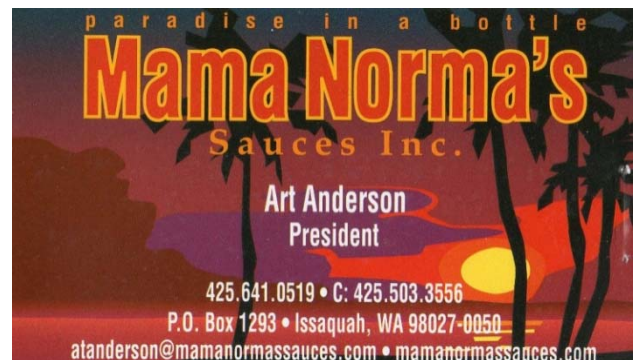
c. No broad heads or blunts are allowed on the courses.

Sec 7: Use of Field Target Range

The same rules prevail on the field courses as on the animal courses.

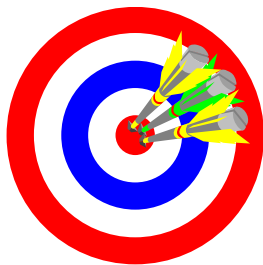
## Reminder about Club Gates

The first gate (Community Gate) to the Range is to be kept closed and locked at all times by all members entering or leaving the Range. The second gate (Club gate) may be left open while the Range is in use. The last person leaving the range is responsible to make sure the Club gate is closed and locked. Thanks.

## CRB Summer League Outdoor Shoot

**When:** Tuesday evenings, shooting will start about 6:30 pm. No potluck.

**What:** Shoot a different course each week for three months. We will start with course "B" for a Field Round because we have the right targets on



that course. Other "Rounds" will be . . . a Burlap Round, a Flat Range Round and either a Broadhead Round or a Hunter Round. These details have not been worked out yet. One round each week for three months.

This is just a rough idea of what will be going on. Complete details have not been finalized. Mike Stefanik and Patrick Seiver will be working out the final stuff.

Scoring on the field and hunter rounds are . . . 5, 4, 3, 2, 1. X counts are kept to decide ties. I believe the other scoring is . . . 10, 9, 8, 7, 6.

Next I will print some info from what Dave Garrison said earlier about a NFAA Field Shoot. Ours is similar but not exactly the same.

A Field Round is two courses of fourteen target butts with white targets with black centers shot from white stakes for adults, blue stakes for youth and black stakes for cubs. When adults and youth shoot from the same stake (50 yards and under) the stakes are white and blue. Each target butt is shot 4 times. Sometimes from the same state or from different stakes when so marked. Examples of multiple stakes are the 80 yard walk up shot at 80, 70, 60, and 50 yards or the 35 yard fan shot from 4 different stakes all 35 yards.

The Hunter Round is also two courses of fourteen target butts but with black targets with white centers. Four arrows at each butt. Adults shoot from red stakes, youth from blue stakes with red spot. (where the youth stake is the same yardage on the field round and hunter round, the stake will be blue with a white and a red spot) Like the Field Round, when the youth and adults shoot from the same stake it is multicolored. In this case blue and red. Cubs shoot the same black stakes as for the field round.

The Animal Round is fourteen target butts. The targets are animals with marked rings for scoring. Each target is shot one, two or three times. Only one arrow scores. Second and third arrows score progressively less. Second and third arrows may also be shot from closer stakes for lower score.

The adult stakes are yellow, youth are blue with yellow dot, when adults and youth have the same stake it will be yellow and blue. Cubs shoot from the same black stakes as the field round.

### WDFW starts mandatory boat checks to stop aquatic invasive species

OLYMPIA - Starting Memorial Day weekend, boaters heading to Washington waterways may encounter new mandatory stops by the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) to check for aquatic invasive species.

The long-planned emphasis patrol, which will take place throughout the summer, coincides with the recent seizure of a boat in Spokane contaminated with quagga mussels from Nevada's Lake Mead. A multi-state tracking effort and tips from alert citizens led to the seizure by WDFW enforcement officers.

The 24-foot boat has been decontaminated to avoid the spread of the tiny non-native mollusks, which are prohibited in Washington to protect native fish and wildlife and water systems.

"These invasive mussels, first found in Lake Mead in 2007, have already spread to other waterways in several western states, and continue to move closer to Washington every year," said Allen Pleus, WDFW aquatic invasive species coordinator. "That's a big concern, because if they get into our waters, they will likely spread rapidly and cause much damage."

Importation of aquatic invasive species is a gross misdemeanor punishable by up to \$5,000 in fines and up to a year in jail.

Knowingly bringing such species into Washington is a felony and can result in even greater fines and jail time.

The Spokane case is still under investigation and no charges have been filed, said Sergeant Eric Anderson, WDFW aquatic invasive species enforcement coordinator.

"To avoid more close calls like this, our enforcement emphasis this year will be to conduct random, mandatory road stops of people hauling any size boat," Anderson said.

Since Washington passed a law in 2002 prohibiting importation of aquatic invasive species, WDFW, in cooperation with the Washington State Patrol, has mainly worked to inspect commercially hauled watercraft at the state's port of entry weigh stations. But that only stopped a handful of very large vessels, Anderson said.

"In the last few years we've conducted more periodic vessel inspections during fishing seasons at our water access sites where information about these species is posted," Anderson said. "Now we're moving to an even more aggressive enforcement effort. Boats found with banned species could be seized for decontamination." Recreational boaters and anglers should always carefully inspect and clean their boats and equipment before moving their vessels from one body of water to another, Pleus said.

"Boat owners must take responsibility for their vessels if Washington is going to be successful at keeping aquatic invasive species from spreading to state waters," Pleus said.

Once established, non-native mussels and other aquatic invasive species can multiply quickly and threaten native fish and wildlife by consuming available food and smothering other species. They spread by attaching to boats or other water-based equipment, and clog water-intake systems at power plants, irrigation districts, public water suppliers, and other facilities.

"If these species become established in the Columbia River system it could result in billions of dollars of economic damage to everything from hydro-electric dams to municipal water systems and put further strain on ESA-listed species that live there," Pleus said.

Zebra and quagga mussels are native to the Caspian Sea. They entered the Great Lakes in the mid 1980s in ship ballast water, and have since spread to more than 20 states, including California, Colorado, Nevada and Utah, and two Canadian provinces. Both zebra and quagga mussels are easily transported on boats and trailers because they can live out of water for up to a month.

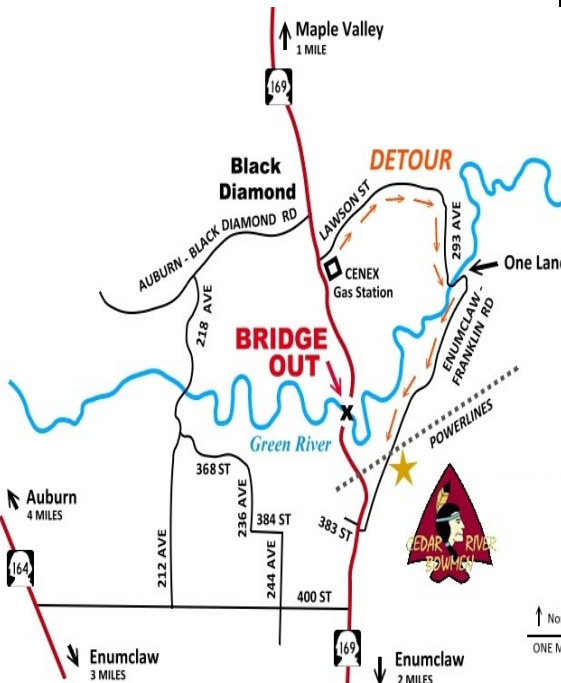
