CRB Board Meeting June 10, 2010

Meeting called to order at 7:52 pm

10 board members and 2 members present

May minutes approved as published in the "Puffs"

Treasurer's Report: Discussed funds in bank. Still need to get Tony to send up records

Membership: 133 members currently. Our goal is 150 members. We had 2 more PayPal errors as it automatically renewed 2 members. Will be sending out recognition of those who referred new members.

Old Business: Did not discuss old business

Rangemaster: Diesel is being delivered tomorrow, CRB set up an account with Don Small and Sons for the diesel. Porta potties were cleaned last Thursday. We need another 55 gallon drum for more diesel and another old metal drum for up at the flat range. Scott will start researching a new generator. July 10th and 17th we have work parties schedule (RANGE WILL BE CLOSED) in preparation for Bownanza. Need to do mowing and brush removal. Galen to spearhead animal repair. Need to change oil and oil filter in the generator (will skip fuel filter). Edo to pick up the oil. Need to pick up the tree that was cut up between A2 and A3

Tournament Chair: Field shoot, short on dots. Chris and Don will go look at the targets. Some animal targets are old style. Chris has the scorecards for this shoot. Iron Amos is also this weekend, will probably not have a good turn out. Chris had heard complaints about the 8am shot gun start, will look into that for the next field shoot. Work Parties, Tournaments, & Ranges

In case you're wondering: In addition to the regularly scheduled work parties during the first part of the year, as a rule of thumb (sometimes there are changes to this), the Club typically has a work party the Saturday before each of our tournaments. Reminder about Club Gates

The first gate (Community Gate) to the Range is to be kept closed and locked at all times by all members entering or leaving the Range. The second gate (Club gate) may be left open while the Range is in use. **The last person leaving the range is responsible to make sure the Club gate is closed and locked.** Thanks.

"BLOCK TARGETS" Used at Range

Please be advised if you use a "Block" or similar target to sight in your broadheads at the range, you are responsible to clean up after yourself. In the past, members have put their "Blocks" in the sand pits; leaving a mess from the pieces of the "Block" laying all over.

Also, please do not dig out the sand and set your "Block" into the sand pit. People who have done this in the past have caused allot of sand to spill out the front of the enclosure and left the sand on the ground and the "pit" in a mess. Please put your "Blocks" in front of the sand pits or off to the side so other members don't have to clean up the sand. Your mother doesn't live here so remember to clean up after yourself. Thanks.

NO BROADHEADS ALLOWED on COURSES or FLAT RANGE!

All members please be advised, that broadheads are NOT ALLOWED anywhere on the Range except at the Broadhead Pits.

Broadhead Pits

As a reminder, you need to bring your own targets (paper plates are fine) and please pick them up when you are finished shooting so as not to leave a mess for the next person. Also, when shooting the Broadhead pits, remember to stomp the sand down behind where you place your target so the sand is dense enough to stop your arrow. You'll need to do this after every 4 - 6 shots. When pulling your arrows out of the sand, be careful if putting your hands into the sand, there may be broadheads or blades in the sand that could cut you! Do not shoot field points into the pits as they do not have enough "drag" to slow the arrow down and they will go deep into the pit and make recovery difficult. A good tool to have with you is an old toothbrush. A toothbrush will allow you to knock off any remaining sand off the arrow shaft and broadhead prior to shooting it again. Have fun!

Broadhead Tuning

(From Easton's Tuning Guide)

In general terms, broadhead tuning is done by first shooting a group of arrows with field points into the target, and then by shooting a group of arrows with broadheads. The two groups are compared and the appropriate adjustments are made. **CAUTION:** Never shoot unfletched shafts with broadheads—flight is extremely erratic and dangerous! The field points should be as close in weight as possible to the weight of the broadheads. Because it is necessary to first establish a good group with field points, broadhead tuning can be done only after acceptable tuning has been established with field points.

Shoot a Group with Field Points (If Shooting At CRB; Carpet Bales On The Flat Range May Be Used. Field Tips Only):

Using a set of field-tipped arrows that have been tuned with your bow, shoot a group of 3 or 4

arrows into the target at 30 yards. Take care to shoot as good a group as you are capable.

Shoot a group with Broadheads: (If Shooting At CRB; Broadhead Sand Pits Are The Only Area Broadheads Are Allowed)

Using identical arrows tipped with broadheads, shoot a group of 3 or 4 arrows into your 30 yard target (**Broadhead Sand Pits Only**). Use the same aiming spot that was used for the field points. The shot group is the key. If you are content you have shot a respectable group based on your ability, then compare the position of the two groups. Make the adjustments listed below to your setup and shoot both groups again. Keep adjusting and shooting until both groups (field points and broadheads) group in the same area.

Adjustments:

Adjustments sometimes effect more than is expected. It is best to always make the up/down adjustments first. Once the two groups are on the same horizontal plane, then make the left/right adjustments.

1. If the broadheads grouped above the field points, move the nocking point up.
 2. If the broadheads group below the field points, move the nocking point down.
 3. If the broadheads group to the left, they are behaving as if the shaft is too stiff (for a right handed archer). Any, or several, of the following can be done to correct the point of impact.
 - Increase the poundage on the bow.
 - Change to heavier broadheads.
 - If you are using a cushion plunger, decrease the spring tension.
 - Move the arrow rest or cushion plunger in toward the bow. Make adjustments 1/32" at a time
 4. If the broadheads group to the right, they are behaving as if the shaft is too weak. Any or several of the following can be done to correct the point of impact.
 - Decrease the poundage on the bow.
 - Change to lighter broadheads.
 - If you are using a cushion plunger, increase the spring tension.
 - Move the arrow rest or cushion plunger out away from the bow. Make adjustments 1/32" at a time.
- Remember, broadhead tuning can only be accomplished after the bow has been properly setup and tuned with field or target points.

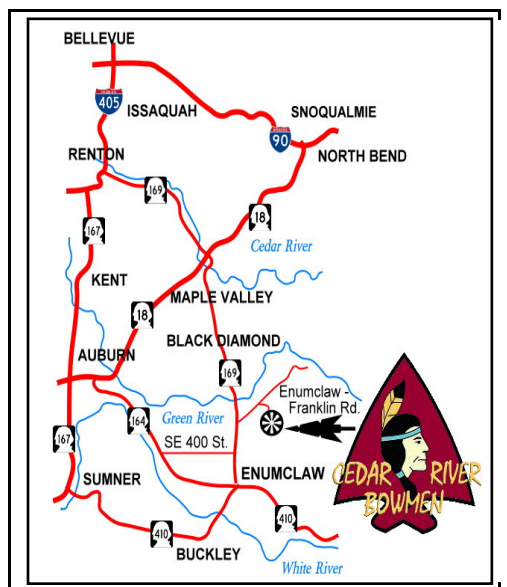
