## Report On Marked 3D Safari

CRB held the Marked 3D Safari on Saturday and Sunday; March 5 & 6, 2011. It really was a good shoot and drew many compliments about club. Chris Ray chaired the event and setup 28 marked yardage 3D safari targets emulating Redding, CA style. He did all the prep with help from Donnie who repaired our "shot to H..." broadhead targets. Our new cook shack chairman,

Shad, jumped in and with Edo and Roxanne's help did a good job of running it for the first time this year. As always and still fresh from an operation Galen did his magic with wood and brass to make and deliver the trophies.

We had 104 shooters for our first 3D safari shoot. Within this count were 7 Professionals and one token "Why Not?." Ed Ely joined the group of Pros in our Pro Purse. Scoring was 11, 10, 8 (orange dot, 10 ring, body respectively) for a possible total score of 616. Top score of 613 was obtained by Wyatt Johnson (Pro). Joe Mallicoat, another Pro, was second highest scorer at 611 and third was Sean Elza (Freestyle) at 608. These guys are good shooters and since none, even the Pros were able to get 100% shows you that target shooting isn't as simple and easy as many of us 3D lovers may think it to be.

## CRB Board Minutes March 10, 2011

Meeting brought to order at 6:30 p.m.

12 board Member present, 1 regular member

**Secretary's Report:** Minutes of the last Board meeting were approved as published in the "Puffs"

**Treasurer's Report:** not present

**Range Master's Report:** not present. Work List is in a binder at the Registration Booth for members to review when at the Club. If a lot of people show up to a work party, someone needs to step up and take the lead and point volunteers in the right direction. Need to have work party sign-up sheets at the work parties to track who receives tokens. Cart for stand behind mower purchased and installed, ready for work.

**Tournament Chairman Report:** Club made a profit on the last shoot (Safari 3-D). Shoot cards need to get out sooner. Talked about marked 3-d Safari in April next year. Patching on 3 targets didn't hold up, found with goop inside. Dustin brought up using silica flour to heat up or thicken and cure to repair the targets. Mike knows what to do to correct this. Need more signs and markers to know where to shoot from, as it was a little unclear at this shoot. Chris Ray deserves an "Atta boy" for a well organized event.

If a shoot gets set up on a Thursday, someone needs to be staying at the Club Thursday and Friday nights to make sure nothing is stolen. Friday is normal set-up day. This is something that should be brought up to the Board prior to set up and approved.

May 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> is IBO NWTC at the Club. Need to make sure we have 40 colored stakes for each category of shooter. Need to set up a practice range; Mike will make sure this gets done.

Looking for Course Captains for Bownanza. Dustin Veenker, Dave with Walt as assistant, Doug Lyons will help, all volunteered. Captains are responsible for course set up and safety of their respective courses. Mike must know what animals used on each course to put shooter's map together. 40 targets first day, 30 targets second day. Need to know the number of shots on each course by day. Need two more Course Captains, will check with Edo and Scott. Jim thinks we should put the adult and kid's money dots at the same location this year. We will flip flop adult and kids targets from Saturday to Sunday on the money dots and course captains should change shooting stakes Saturday night. At all moving targets we need to have a stationary target for those shooting for score rather than money.

Mike discussed building a "Sponge Bob Square Pants" for Bownanza. Galen will build a zebra.

**Bowhunting Chairman:** Nothing to report

**Old Business:** Jim will not be at the Banquet. Patrick has all the information. Door prize and Raffle tickets needed, they are in the white container. Galen and Dave have the different trophies for the banquet.

**Membership Chairman:** 102 paid members plus 15 Honorary or Life members. Open house is on March 19<sup>th</sup>.

**New Business:** IBO Insurance has been paid and sent in. Range needs to be inspected; we are good through June 30<sup>th</sup> 2011. Range certification runs July through June. WSAA and NFAA charter runs from January through December and has been paid.

Mike said he would look into CRB putting on a class for other clubs on how to repair targets but we will not do their repairs.

Need to get e-mails out to schedule people for the Cook Shack up to a month before a shoot. Keep sending until all slots are filled. Shad is looking into purchasing food from Sysco.

Steak dinners discussed, 125 needed. If anyone finds a good deal on steaks contact Jim Walker 253-735-2200. Up to \$500 approved.

Discussed the possibility of a trophy or something to give an "Atta boy" to the members that go above and beyond in helping out at the Club. A Work Horse dinner for such members was approved. Looking at April's Board meeting to decide where, what and who.

This year's banquet will be at Krain's Corner.

Need new bid on port-a-potties, hand sanitizers and toilet seat covers.. Patrick will look into this.

Generator needs to be strapped to floor. Need to make new instruction sheet on generator operation.

Gravel needed around Club was discussed. Dave will order a load from PCC.

## CRB Tokens ( Wooden Nickles) For Help at CRB

As mentioned in the last Puffs, we will be handing out tokens called Wooden Nickels at scheduled work parties and scheduled shift work at our tournaments. Here is how it will work; for any 3 hours worked you will receive 1 wooden nickel or for 6 hours; 2 wooden nickles and so on. (Typically our work parties are scheduled for 6 hours and shift work at tournaments are scheduled for 3 hours.) **You must sign in at a work party or tournament to receive your token, no exceptions! It will be up to each member to make sure they get their wooden nickles for work performed at a work party or tournament and also be responsible for them once they leave the premises.** Wooden nickles can be received from any Range Master at work parties or through the Tournament Chairman or Cook Shack Coordinator at tournaments. At this time a wooden nickel will be worth \$5 in food or drink at the cook shack or \$5 toward tournament registration, but will have no other cash value. This is a way for you to help out around YOUR Club and get something in return. We hope this incentive program benefits the Club as well as its members.

## CRB 2011 Work List

### 1. Clubhouse:

- a. Seal the leaks in roof in Clubhouse.
- b. Secure carpet in Clubhouse.
- c. Pop machine needs maintenance (B.J. has friend that can do this).
- d. Remove and burn or take to dump all junk from clubhouse. It is a mess, as someone keeps bringing old wooden tables and other crap and leaving it for the club to dispose of.
- e. Pressure wash picnic tables and seal. Need to fill water containers for pressure washer. (Coordinate this with Mike Garrett).
- f. Sand and apply a couple of coats of sealer to picnic tables.
- g. Replace window on north and south end of clubhouse.

### 2. Registration Booth:

- a. Finish installing plywood inside of registration booth and paint.
- b. Paint counter with epoxy or garage floor paint. (Gray)
- c. Install kickplate in front of registration booth.
- d. Rebuild (or) tear down and burn table outside Reg. booth
- e. Install new lighting in registration booth, 4' or 8' foot fixture would be perfect".
- f. Find and fix leaks in registration booth roof.
- g. Install new door or fix existing door.. **Partially Done.**
- h. Remove landing outside door and replace with one that is sloped correctly.

### 3. Cook Shack:

- a. Repair leak under sink.
- b. Counters need painting.
- c. Install soap dispenser. **Done**
- d. Fill water containers. (See #1 / e.)

- e. Erect metal pop-up shelter in front of cookshack. Edo has tarp.
- f. Paint pop-up metal canopy shelter.
- g. Need to replace hot water tank or gas valve **(ASAP) Done**

### 4. Range:

- a. Replace targets as needed throughout range.
- b. Trim and clean trails and roadways as needed.
- c. Cut downed trees as needed and stack in firewood shed.
- d. Have target pasting party for targets needed for paper shoots and flat range.
- e. Inventory all re-bar and straighten. Make sure we have enough colored shooting stakes; 40 of each.
- f. 3-D target repair day to patch and paint targets for broadhead targets.
- g. Generator: Purchase diesel fuel. Change fuel filter, air and oil filter. **Done**
- h. Mowers: Check oil levels. Fill with gas. Fill Gas container. Check and/or charge batteries. Sharpen or replace blades.
- i. Spray for noxious weeds in the Spring.
- j. Acquire gravel for roadways if needed.
- k. Target signs on "C" and "D" courses. (Patrick)
- l. Coat kid's swing set as needed with waterproofing.
- m. Remove lawnmower from area by Flat Range. **Done**
- n. Kid's swing was damaged in windstorm and needs to be repaired.
- o. Replace target signs that have blown down.

### 5. Flat Range:

- a. Upgrade and use cement blocks for center supports on all targets and 2 X 6's bolted to existing sheds and line with fire hose. Need 26 each PT 2 X 6's, 6 cement blocks (as there are 7 by containers), and 26 each bolts, nuts, and washers. Install 6" fire hose where needed.
- b. Replace RR tie on left side of 25 yard butt.
- c. Replace targets as needed.

### 6. Containers:

- a. Re-wire switches and for lights in containers.
- b. Add vents to generator container.
- c. Install hold downs for new generator.

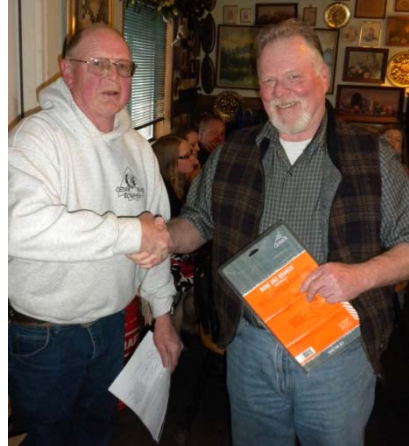
The Largest Elk Award (6 x 6 with a score of 330) went to Robert Zyskowski, who wasn't present.

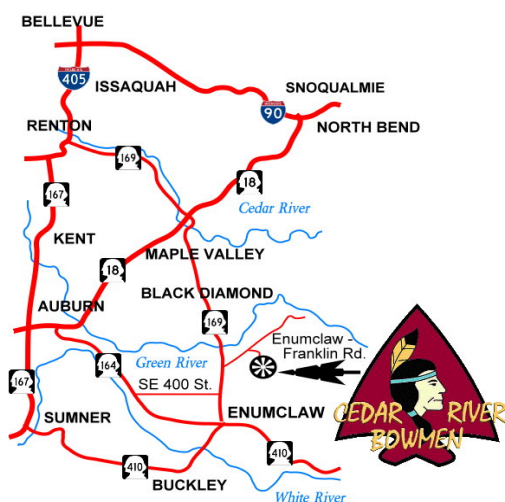
